DAY 01 - DAY 20

DAY 1

We meet at the Arusha hotel for the start of your journey of discovery and an incredible safari through East and Southern Africa. We start our day with a drive to Ngorongoro Crater, we spend the afternoon on the Crater floor and overnight at the foot of this World Heritage Site at Ngorongoro Farmhouse with your meals and game drives included. Enjoy this collapsed volcano that has the endangered Black Rhino, some of the biggest elephant alive today and the rest of the Big 5.

Ngorongoro Crater

Few things in Tanzania compare to the breathtaking natural beauty of the Ngorongoro Crater. Widely regarded as the "Eighth Wonder of the World" and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, this collapsed volcanic caldera covers an area of 8300 square kilometers and encompasses several different ecosystems.

What makes Ngorongoro special is its concentration of animals. An estimated 30 000 animals - including the famed Big 5 - inhabit an area of 260 square kilometers inside the 600m deep caldera, which forms its own, unique eco-system. Ngorongoro is literally "Wildlife Central"! Geologists believe that the Ngorongoro volcano was originally 1000m higher than Mount Kilimanjaro, which at 5891m is the highest peak in Africa. Its eruptions regularly deposited ash to the west of Ngorongoro up until the volcano collapsed around 2-million years ago, cultivating the only habitat that can sustain the birth of half a million wildebeest calves in two months on an annual basis.

The ash deposits also made for the ideal preservation of fossil remains in the area, and led to the archeological discoveries of early human remains made by Dr Louis Leaky and his wife, Mary, at Olduvai Gorge just to the west of the Ngorongoro highlands. The greater Ngorongoro Conservation Area is also home to one of the most iconic tribes in Africa - the Maasai - who were moved here from the Serengeti. With their nomadic lifestyle, the Maasai co-exist with relatively minimal impact on their wild neighbours, helping to preserve this unique African treasure.

Ngorongoro Farmhouse was built with the intention of offering clients an original experience reminiscent of the atmosphere of the old days.

The lodge is a perfect stopover within any safari in the Northern Circuit of Tanzania. Ngorongoro Farm House offers a range of activities including safari to the adjacent forest leading to the Oldeani Volcano or an excursion to the nearby Lake Eyasi in the Rift Valley, still inhabited by a tribe of hunter-gatherers, the Hadzabe, a relic of ancient times who still follow a style of life similar to the humans who inhabited the Earth before the discovery of agriculture.

Ngorongoro Farm House has 50 large cottages with ample space inside, built in the style of an old colonial farm and rustically decorated with local materials and full of details of good taste. There are 19 Twin rooms, 23 Kings, and 8 triple rooms (6 of these are interconnected). Each suite has a private veranda

There is both cosy indoor and outdoor dining available, as well as private dining on the deck and picnics are available on request.

Special dietary requirements can be accommodated with advance notice. The water is safe to drink, and bottled water is placed in your room courtesy of Ngorongoro Farm House.

DAY 2 & 3

2 full days in the most incredible National Park in the world and with a bit of luck we show you the annual wildebeest migration, massive lion prides and very good leopard. Overnight at Kati Kati Camp in the heart of the Serengeti with your meals and full day game drives included. Good thing you have your camera with you.

Serengeti National Park

The Serengeti National Park is arguably the most famous in the world today, thanks largely to the millions of wildebeest which migrate across it every year. It is, quite literally, a paradise and in safari terms, if you have not experienced the magic of the Serengeti's vast, sweeping plains, then you have not truly experienced Africa.

The Serengeti has three distinct areas, each of which is a must if you want to fully appreciate this magnificent place. By exploring the whole of the Serengeti, you are virtually assured of seeing the legendary wildebeest somewhere on your itinerary!

The "endless plains" to the south were formed more than 3-million years ago when the then active Ngorongoro volcano deposited ash onto granite bedrock. This is where the Great Migration reaches its peak, with more than 2-million wildebeest, accompanied by zebra and antelope, spend three months of the year giving birth to their young. The woodlands area covers almost two thirds of the Serengeti, and this is the secret of its success as a wildlife paradise because the majority of animal species need a combination of open savanna and woodland habitat to survive. The granite hills of the Serengeti form the third part of this incredible place, and play a crucial role in its ecosystem. If you imagine the Serengeti as a bath, then these rock hills are the plug, preventing the much needed ground water from seeping away and providing perennial springs and water holes.

The area you should visit depends on the time of year you will travel, as each is unique and spectacular.

Kati Kati mobile tented camp located in Central Serengeti, in a campsite known as MaKoma. Strategically located to cover the vast of Serengeti Plains. Comfortable accommodation. Unique opportunity to experience a safari camp Only a two hour scenic drive from Olduvai Gorge Museum and Grumeti River.

On the banks of the Thamalakane river, the Lodge is only 20 minutes' drive from Maun, Botswana, on the way to the Moremi Game Reserve.

Mealtimes at the Thamalakane River Lodge are events not to be missed. The thatch and wood restaurant overlooks the Thamalakane river and the splendour of the surroundings is matched only by the superb food. In addition to the famous signature dishes of the Thamalakane River Lodge, diners can also expect to find local seasonal treats on the regularly changing menu.
